Ensemble Vocale di Napoli Formed in 1983, the Ensemble Vocale di Napoli pursues an intense concert-giving activity, drawing on constant research into vocal technique and performing practice. Its repertoire covers the whole gamut of choral production, from early music to the

Baroque era and contemporary creations.

The Ensemble, which collaborates frequently with instrumental groups performing choral works in stile concertato, has taken part in important national and international competitions. It took first prize in the Rassegna Internazionale di Canto Corale di Alghero (1991 and 1992) and in the XII Concorso Nazionale Guido D'Arezzo (1995). It has made recordings for the FonitCetra, Fonè, Opus 111 and Niccolò recording compresione.

recording companies.

In addition to working closely with Neapolitan musical fig-

ures of the stature of Roberto De Simone and Antonio Florio, the Ensemble has appeared in important productions under S. Accardo (Cosi fan tutte, W.A. Mozart), R. Clemencic (Motets, G.B. Pergolesi), P. Maag (Requiem, Mozart - St John Passion, J.S. Bach), M. Pradella (Gloria, Vivaldi) and V. Spivakov (Coronation Mass, Mozart). It has been invited to sing in the concert seasons of several of the most prestigious Italian musical institutions. In December 1998 it featured in Mozart's Requiem with "I cameristi del Teatro della Scala". In June 2003 it gave two concerts in Milan as part of the celebrations for the 600th anniversary of the Cappella Musicale of the city's cathedral. In 2004 it sang in Liszt's Via Crucis under the direction of Michele Campanella; this collaboration was renewed in May 2006, taking Rossini's Petite Messe Solennelle to Beijing and Shanghai as part of the "Anno dell'Italia in Cina". In July 2006 the choir participated in the celebrations for the 500th anniversary of the rebuilding of the Basilica of San Pietro in Vaticano, giving the première of the Oratorio

"Petros Eni" by Antonio Pappalardo. 2008 has seen its production of the first Italian performance of Passio by Arvo Pärt, and the recreation of Cotumacci's Messa Kyrne e Gloria in collaboration with the Orchestra da Camera della Campania, as well as a concert for the Accademia Chigiana in Siena. Since May 2007 the Ensemble Vocale di Napoli has had the monumental Basilica of Santa Maria Maggiore, in the heart of the city,

has its permanent headquarters and concert venue.

Patrizio Marrone. Born in Naples, is teacher of Composition at Conservatory "San Pietro a Majella" in Naples.

His compositions have been performed in the best national and international institutions as: Ente Lirico di Cagliari, Teatro San Carlo di Napoli, Opera di Rouen, Conservatory of Cincinnati, Festival di Belfort, Ensemble Modern di Francoforte, Associazione Alessandro Scarlatti di Napoli,

Conservatori OF Naples, Festival di Ravello, Worldsax 2006(Lubiana), Festival "Jusqu'aux Oreilles" Montreal, Parlamento Europeo.

Thanks to his interest in literary works he has created original musical works for camera theatre as: Don Chisciotte,

Cantata for Cirano, Memorie di una maschera. His numberless compositions of stage music, ballets and musicals such Masaniello, La Tempesta, Sogno di una notte di mezza Estate, Amleto, Commedia degli equivoci,

Romeo e Giulietta, La Bella e la Bestia, Le Troiane, have a very important roole in his musical production. He has composed a musical play for children "Il respiro del

Bosco" and the musical commedy "Annata ricca". He revised and performed the "Mottetti per le quarant ore "by "Erasmo di Bartolo", monumental sacred

quarant ore by "Erasmo di Bartolo", monumental sacred work of the 1600, from Neapolitan School, in four chorus, preserved among old dated partiture in the historical library of "San Pietro a Majella" in Naples and the first mondial performance was in Naples Cathedral after 350 years.

Roberto Altieri. Neapolitan composer, pianist, conductor and professor, born in 1958. He earned four degrees at the Conservatorio di musica S. Pietro a Majella in Naples: Composition, Piano, Choral composition and conducting, Orchestral conducting. And then the Merit Diploma at the masterclass of Composition at the Accademia Chigiana in Siena. Winner of several prizes in Italian and international composers competitions; he wrote more than one hundred works, performed in Italy and many European countries. Some of his compositions are edited by Berben, Ancona. He has had an extensive career as a choral and orchestral conductor. Professor of Harmony, Counterpoint, Fugue and Composition at the Conservatorio di musica S. Pietro a Majella in Naples since 1999. He edited a critical revision of Francesco Mancini?s cantata La Rosa for the modern-time première in 2001, and wrote, with the pianist M. Pia Cellerino, two books about Domenico Scarlatti's Sonatas.

Ciro Zingone. At eight years started to play guitar, studying then with M.o Bruno Battisti D'Amario at the Conservatorio di muica 'S. Pietro a Majella' in Naples. He followed Masters classes with Oscar Ghiglia (Accademia Chigiana, 1993) then with David Russell, Angelo Gilardino, Tilman Hoppstock (1999). He plays in concert as soloist and whitin ensembles in Italy and abroad (trento, Molveno, Milano, Vicenza, Savona, Bologna, Firenze, Roma, Napoli, Ravello, Bari, Messina, Mons, Granada, Aix en Provence, Lisbona, Braga). He won several prizes at national and international level and teaches guitar at the I.C. 'A. Casanova' in Naples. He first recorded unpublished music and guitar transcriptions by Weiss, Gragnani, Battisti D'Amario, Piazzolla.
