



Post-congress report 2018 from LIMTI

LIMTI officers Chuck Peters and Aris Bazmadelis attended the annual congress of IAML in Leipzig, Germany, which took place from 22-27 July, 2018.

LIMTI hosted two open sessions during the congress.

The first session, Cultural Heritage, Special Libraries and the Digital Future, was held in the Conference Room, University Library and included three presentations:

- “New Horizons: on the Future of Libraries at Universities of Music in Germany” / Katharina Hofmann (Hochschule für Musik Franz Liszt Weimar)
- “Music Librarianship in China: Observations from an Exchange Program” / Carla Williams (Ohio University, Athens, OH)
- “Digitization of Music as Cultural Heritage” / Anne Helle Jespersen (University Library of Southern Denmark, Odense)

The second session, Assessing, Archiving and Providing Access to Online Resources, was held in the Concert Hall, Hochschule für Musik und Theater and included three presentations:

- “Does the Data Ring True? An Analysis of Electronic Music Journals at McGill University” / Joseph Hafner (IAML Vice President; McGill University, Montreal)
- “Once upon a Time There Was a Website – Archiving Websites for the Musicological Community” / Jürgen Diet and Paul Zimmermann (Bayerische Staatsbibliothek, Munich)
- “Collecting Contemporary Composers: from Cooperative Collection Building to Cooperative Web Archiving” / Elizabeth Davis and Samantha Abrams (Columbia University, New York, NY)

Chuck Peters was the moderator for both sessions.

Chuck Peters represented LIMTI at the meeting of the Forum of Sections, where section aims and objectives were submitted:

- To develop a list of useful resources and projects to be posted on the LIMTI pages of the IAML website and made publicly available.
- To promote our professional area via the web, social media or other means.
- To undertake a survey of users or librarians on an issue relating to our particular area of concern. Topics related to collections, library instruction, technology, and student and faculty demographics are under consideration. The opinions of section members will be solicited.
