Facebook

Our Facebook reach, whilst smaller than our Twitter account, with 245 followers, has grown 7% from the same time last year. Our content is regularly shared by International IAML and our IAML colleagues in New Zealand.

At the last AGM, there was the suggestion of setting up a Facebook group to facilitate discussion among members. Suggested wording regarding admission to the online group was circulated to the Executive and discussed at the last Executive meeting. Twitter

Our Twitter account continues to gain followers, as of 10 September numbering 956 (an increase of 3% from the same time last year). Content generated is regularly retweeted by the International IAML account, as well as others in the GLAM sector.

This year, IAML took part in the daily tweet fest that was Library and Information Week 2020 Create online (#LIW2020), running from May 25-31. Each day had a theme: Create connections, Create inspiration, Create disruption, Create skills, Create what, Create characters and Create fun.
