The programme included excursions to the Traditional Music Centre, the Culture Academy and the Music School, a workshop on playing jew's harp, instructed by the excellent jew's harp and also bagpipe player Cätlin Mägi, and a lecture-concert on traditional wind instruments, presented by the outstanding musician, teacher and wind instrument maker Juhan Suits.
