



## THE PENDLEBURY LIBRARY OF MUSIC, CAMBRIDGE: 1880 – 1980

This year the Pendlebury Library celebrates the centenary of the gift of Richard Pendlebury to the University of his collection of about 2000 volumes of music. It was first housed in the Fitzwilliam Museum library, and in 1882 regulations were drawn up to include the privilege of borrowing at a time when there were no other music lending libraries in the University. During the first fifty years it grew only slowly, apart from a few substantial gifts, from the British Museum in 1889 and the Royal College of Music in 1915 of duplicates, and from Mrs Cobb in memory of her husband G.F. Cobb of Trinity College in 1905.

In 1925, the Fitzwilliam, always uncomfortable about having a section for loan in its otherwise reference collections, had the music transferred to the University Library. Here it remained in packing cases in a basement for a year until Professor Dent took it upon himself to remove the collection to the Faculty of Music. Four years later the University officially entrusted the collection to the Faculty and renamed it the Pendlebury Library of Music. Since then it has moved twice, first to Downing Place in 1935, and then in 1977 to a large Victorian house next door to the University Music School's new concert hall and lecture rooms in West Road.


The original gift included much modern music of the late 19th century, often in first edition, and is particularly rich in Brahms, Chaikovsky, Dvořák, Grieg and Saint-Saëns, all of whom visited the University to receive

honorary doctorates of music. Since the creation of the Music Tripos (the B.A. degree in music) in 1947 and the appointment of Charles Cudworth as Curator the collections have grown more rapidly. Some emphasis has been put on music, sound recordings and books for study rather than performance. Though the latter has always played a large and important part in the life of the University, the C.U. Musical Society and the C.U. Musical Club, which are responsible for encouraging the performance of choral and orchestral music and chamber music respectively, have their own libraries.

Among the more interesting gifts in recent years have been collections of manuscript transcriptions by Professors Dent and Trend of Italian and Spanish music, the fascinating manuscript diaries and recollections of the composer R.J.S. Stevens (1757–1837), and a number of early editions of J.S. Bach, including several late 18th-century musical treatises which take examples from his music, presented by Laurence Picken.

In the future we look forward to the possibility of a new building attached to the new Music School as well as an increasing responsibility towards the provision for music for performance. Maybe it should be mentioned that the Pendlebury is not part of the University Library, which has its own very large music section mainly intended to serve the needs of research.
