

J.S. Bach: Well-Tempered Clavier, Book 2, digitised 2000








Turning the Pages[™] – Handel's *Messiah*, 2008






Digitised Manuscripts platform






Universal Viewer platform



Today

About **12%** of BL's 13K+ volumes of music manuscripts are digitised (excludes uncatalogued items)

About **1.2%** of BL's 1.5 million+ items of printed music are digitised
