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
*) Harald Hårdrådes saga Kap. 45 mod slatten lyder: Da Einar Tambar-skjelves hustru Bergliot, som sad tilbage i herberget i byen, spurgte mandens og sønnens fald, gik hun straks op i kongsgården, hvor bonde-haren var og ophidsede den meget til slag. Men i samme øjeblik rodde kongen ud efter elven. Da sagde Bergliot: „nu savner vi her min fraude Håkon Ivarsøn; ikke skulde Einars banemand ro ud efter elven, om Håkon stod her på elvebakken.“

*) In der Harald Hardradi's - Sage lautet Cap. 45 gegen den Schluss: Als Einar Thambarskelsir's Weib Bergliot, welche in der Herberge der Stadt (Drontheim) zurückblieb, erfuhr, dass ihr Mann und Sohn (Eindride) gefallen seien, ging sie sofort nach der Königsburg hinauf, wo das Bauern-heer war, und feuerte dasselbe eifrig zum Kampfe an. Aber im selben Augenblicke ruderte der König (Harald Hardradi) den Fluss hinab. Da sagte Bergliot: „Jetzt vermissen wir hier meinen Vetter Hakon Ivarson; Einars Mörder sollte nicht den Fluss hinabrudern, wenn Hakon hier am Ufer stände.“





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Portrait of Edvard Grieg 1890


