


- McGill Conservatorium established in 1904.
- Faculty of Music constituted in 1920.
- Earliest consulted evidence of demand-driven acquisition: 1924.
- 1930s: Carnegie Corporation funding enabled modest collecting in response to music faculty requests.

Dean Harry Crane Perrin's memo to University Librarian Gerhard Lomer, 10 Dec. 1924.

- 3. The Committee proposes to allot to a department annually a sum to be used for both books and periodicals on the department list. Departments will thus be able to decide for themselves the proportional amounts to be spent on books and periodicals.
- 7. As the Committee is concerned not only with the immediate distribution of funds but with the building up of book collections in a co-ordinated manner, it feels that all departments should actively co-operate in the selection of books and periodicals. As a means to this end, the Committee asks you to designate some member of your Department, who has a specialized knowledge of its books and periodicals and an active interest in library development, to be the representative of your Department in library matters.




The peculiar irony of my position is that of all the institutions represented here McGill is, I venture to say, the only one with a but half-functioning music library, and without benefit of music librarian. Thus, one segment of our holdings is housed in the central university library—Redpath Library—and is in general circulation. The remainder—an important segment comprising an accumulation of old nineteenth century editions inherited by gift and bequeathal, as well as a solid core of recent publications in the field of collected editions—is scattered about, uncatalogued, in various nooks and crannies of the Faculty building.

- Growth of program offerings, collections, and student body
- Space inadequacies
- 2. approximately 25% be placed at the disposal of the librarian toward the ordering of both undergraduate and graduate materials (scores, reference works, etc.) at her discretion;

1976 – 1990s: Period of significant growth

- 1978: PhD programs in Musicology, Music Theory, and Music Education introduced
- 1979: MMus in Sound Recording launched
- 1980: Music Library named in honour of late Dean Marvin Duchow
- 1981: First Canadian BMus program in Jazz established
- 1985: Kathleen Toomey departed to pursue a PhD in Scottish history





- 1986: Cynthia Leive appointed Head Librarian
- 1991: MDML relocated to a temporary location
- MDML described as the "heart" of the Faculty









Overall, the relocation of the Marvin Duchow Music Library has been a very positive experience. As a medium-sized facility serving a very large and diverse Faculty of Music, the Library must be extremely flexible. In as much as the right environment has helped us to be flexible and to provide efficient service, the Library is a success. As we look ahead, we are faced with perhaps the more difficult task of providing the scores and recordings which will satisfy our users' needs. We would hope that the next time the Music Library is faced with a space problem, it will be because our collections have overwhelmed us!

- Chance discovery of Music Library Advisory Committee minutes from 1965
- Early generations of MDML workers and stakeholders now in their 80s or 90s
- Major shift in organizational archiving practices around 2000

- Promoting music library's support for music scholarship over time.
- Informing strategic leadership and service planning.
- Strengthening advocacy, outreach, and donor engagement efforts.
- Raising music library's profile at local, national and international levels.
- Trends come and go—good service is the constant!

- Former/current deans and key administrators of Schulich School of Music and McGill Libraries.
- Select SSoM faculty with strong library ties, offering valuable perspectives.

- Thematic analysis
- Data organization and triangulation
- Constructionist approach
- Appreciative inquiry



Appreciative inquiry

"Fundamentally, [appreciative inquiry] seeks, to build a constructive union between a whole people and the massive entirety of what people talk about as past and present capacities ... [and] assumes that every living system has many untapped and rich and inspiring accounts of the positive." (Cooperrider and Whitney, p. 613)
