
# Project: "Creating Innovative Music Culture Contents through Collaboration and Individualization (2014-2017)"

The EMRI has been engaged in this project since December 2014, after successfully competing for a three-year grant awarded by the National Research Foundation of Korea (NRFK). The 2<sup>nd</sup> annual report of the project was submitted in September 2016. The EMRI received an excellent evaluation for its various accomplishments, which included an international academic conference: "Bringing the Past into the Future: Creating and Curating Digital Music Archives" in October 2016; and EMRI members' presentations in national and international conferences, and their publications in national and international journals.

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# Organizing International Conference, "Bringing the Past into Future: Creating and Curating Digital Music Archives" (October 28~29. 2016)

The South Korea Branch of IAML, RISM, and the Ewha Music Research Institute (EMRI) organized an international conference entitled "Bringing the Past into the Future: Creating and Curating Digital Music Archives" on October 28 and 29, 2016. Providing a meeting place of twenty-two scholars specializing in digital music databases, the conference was a forum for current debates and issues in the shifting field of digital music databases. The presenters not only offered an introduction to major ongoing digital music database projects in Europe, the U.S., and Asia, but they also explored new digital tools of interactivity, interoperability and openness, and considered the question of database humanisation. # Symposium and Concert: Celebrating 50 Years of Younghi Pagh-Paan's Compositional Career (October 28, 2016)

The conference began with a pre-conference symposium on the German-Korean composer Younghi Pagh-Paan, whose works and life are documented in the database of East Asian composers that the EMRI has been constructing. Renowned experts of twentieth-century music from Europe and the U.S. shed new light

on this emblematic composer. The speakers included Max Nyffeler (music journalist), Dörte Schmidt (Universität der Künst Berlin), Anne C. Shreffler (Harvard University), Andreas Meyer (Staatliche Hochschule für Musik und Darstellende Kunst Stuttgart), and Joachim Steinheuer (Universität Heidelberg).

After the symposium a concert of works by Younghi Pagh-Paan took place.
