




↑ The scene of the ballet *Istar*, H 130



← Stage design of the ballet *The Amazing Flight*, H 159, by Martinů




↑ Stage design of the opera *Juliette*, H 253, by František Muzika


Newly discovered sources

- The source research is focused on the 1920s and 1930s, the years Martinů spent in Paris
- Reformers of the French theatre
- Parisian theatres that might have inspired Martinů for his work
- The estate of the librettists and other artists with whom Martinů collaborated



Théâtre du Vieux-Colombier

- Founded in 1913 by the theatre producer and dramatist Jacques Copeau (1879–1949)
- Reform of the French theatre "anti-illusory principle"
- Acting school in 1915
- Leaving the theatre in 1924
- Léon Chancerel (1886–1965),
 dramatist and director, pupil of
 Copeau




Théâtre Bériza

- ► Founded in 1924 by the opera singer Marguerite Bériza (1880–1970)
- **►** *The Amazing Flight,* H 159
- Premiere of the L'Histoire du soldat (Igor Stravinsky) in 1924 and Angélique (Jacques Ibert) in 1927
- Programmes from the Bibliothèque nationale de France



Henri Ghéon (1875-1944)

- Librettist of the opera Mariken of Nimègue, H 236/2 I
- Correspondence between
 Martinů and Ghéon (1931–1937), synopsis by Martinů,
 libretto and the play by Ghéon were found in the Bibliothèque nationale de France
- Next volume of the BMCE with the opera Alexander Bis, H 255





Future goals

- To discover more about Martinu's contacts with French artists
- To collect other important texts about French theatre
- Continue collecting all materials for each stage work
- Complete English translations
- Complete editing of the librettos
- The monograph will be published by Königshausen & Neumann in 2023
