#### The International Association of Music Libraries, Archives and Documentation Centres (IAML) is a leading member of the international library and music communities

- IAML currently has approximately 1700 individual and institutional members in some 40 countries throughout the world, with national branches in more than 25 countries on five continents.
- IAML was founded under the auspices of UNESCO in 1951 to promote international cooperation and to support the interests of the profession.
- IAML holds annual congresses.
- IAML publishes *Fontes Artis Musicae*, an academic peer-reviewed journal, free of charge for the members. The journal is accessible online through EBSCO, JSTOR and Project MUSE.



IAML membership is open to any person or institution interested in the work of the Association. Among IAML's members you will find:

- music and audio-visual librarians
- music archivists and documentation specialists
- musicians and musicologists
- orchestra, opera, and chorus librarians
- music publishers and suppliers



#### IAML's principal aims

- encourage and promote the activities of music libraries, archives and documentation centres and strengthen cooperation among individuals and institutions working in these fields
- promote a better understanding of the cultural importance of music libraries, archives and documentation centres nationally and internationally
- promote the particular needs of music within the general library framework
- support projects that improve the provision of music services through bibliography, cataloguing, preservation, digitization and research
- promote professional education and training



#### IAML's Board

The Board is the executive committee of the General Assembly and comprises eight officers:

- Immediate Past President (in the two years following the election of a new President)
- President-Elect (in the third year of the President's term)
- Secretary General
- Treasurer

#### National branches

IAML has national branches in 26 countries (2018). National branches usually serve as that country's music library organisation.

In some of the countries where there is no national branch the members sometimes come together in groups that are not formally constituted as IAML national branches.

In countries that lack a strong music library/archive tradition, the establishment of a national branch of IAML can be a first step in increased activity and improved standards at the national level.

#### The Forum of Sections



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
