

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

### Registration

Conference Registration will take place from 09.30 to 17.00 on Sunday 18 July at the Wellington Town Hall in the Festival and Convention Centre. The location of the Conference Office will be displayed in the foyer of the Town Hall.

### Name Tags

Please ensure that you wear your name tag at all Conference events.

### Opening Ceremony

The opening ceremony, hosted by the Mayor of Wellington, Mark Blumsky, will take place in the Council Chamber located on the 1<sup>st</sup> Floor of the Town Hall building at 18.00. The ceremony will begin with a *pōwhiri* (Māori welcome). Please observe protocol by following the instructions of the Organising Committee. Refreshments are provided.

### Plenary Session

On Tuesday 20 July the morning programme will be devoted to New Zealand and Pacific music. In the first session, Hirini Melbourne and Richard Nunns present *Tē Ara Pūoro: Pathway of Sound*, an illustrated introduction

to the music of the Māori. After morning tea, Allan Thomas will present - *Oral Traditions of the Pacific: Challenge and Reflection*. These sessions will be held in the Ilott Concert Chamber on the Ground Floor of the Town Hall and are sponsored by the Wellington City Council and Te Puni Kōkiri / Ministry of Māori Development.

### Meals

Your Conference kit contains information on places to eat nearest to the Conference venue. Most restaurants are open until late, and many cafés provide both snacks and full meals. All restaurants, and many cafés are also licensed to serve alcohol. The indication "BYO" means that you may bring your own wine. Most eating places serve meals throughout the day, but mealtimes can be summarised as follows:

- 12.00 - 14.00 (Lunch)
- 18.00 onwards (Dinner)

### Smoking

Smoking is not permitted in many public buildings, including the Conference venue. Restaurants and cafés provide clearly designated smoking and non-smoking areas.

### Postal Services

Post Shops are open from 08.30 to 17.30 Monday to Friday and from 10.00 to 13.30 on Saturday. They are closed on Saturday afternoon and Sunday, but stamps may be purchased from newsagents, supermarkets and other retail outlets. The nearest Post Office to the Conference venue is situated at 43 Manners Street, on the corner of Victoria and Manners Streets (opposite McDonalds).

There are many taxi companies in Wellington and fares

are reasonable. Taxi ranks are located throughout the city. The nearest to the Conference venue is located at Bond Street. Please note that you are not obliged to take the first taxi in the rank. Alternatively you can order one by telephone. Hailing taxis in the street is not usual but will work!

Buses are cheap and frequent in the city area. A journey within the central city is \$1. Bus timetables are available free from the Conference Office and many shops in the city.
